Supportive Arts for Adults with (dis)Abilities

This inclusive weekly program offers adults with varying abilities a welcoming space to explore creativity through art, movement, mindfulness and music. Led by skilled educators and a mindfulness coach, each session fosters connection, self-expression and joy — with special visiting artists from around the community adding to the experience.

Community Connections Through Art for Students with (dis)Abilities

This program brings free, inclusive arts education to youth with (dis)abilities in Life Skills and LRC classes, and grew from three to five local schools this year. Through guided artmaking focused on collaboration and community connection, participants build self-confidence and cultivate a stronger sense of belonging among their peers and the community as a whole — both of which are vital factors in supporting youth mental health.
